

Centro Cultural FIESP Art Gallery presents a new exhibition with works from the MAM São Paulo collection

Curated by Cauê Alves and Gabriela Gotoda, the exhibition explores the connections between modern and contemporary art in the MAM collection



The Museum of Modern Art of São Paulo (MAM São Paulo), in partnership with SESI-SP, will hold a landmark exhibition featuring works from the MAM collection at the Centro Cultural Fiesp Art gallery, opening on March 26th. MAM São Paulo: Where the Modern Meets the Contemporary, curated by Cauê Alves and Gabriela Gotoda, brings together over 100 pieces from the museum's esteemed collection.

Highlights include iconic pieces that are familiar to the public, such as Tarsila do Amaral's Paisagem [Landscape] (1948); Di Cavalcanti's Peixe na praia [Fish on the Beach] (1933), and Victor Brecheret's Jaquar (1930), displayed alongside works by other modern masters like Alfredo Volpi, Ismael Nery, and Cândido Porti-

nari. The exhibition will also showcase works by prominent contemporary artists, including Mira Schendel, Leonilson, Carmela Gross, Tunga, Leda Catunda, and Cildo Meireles - the latter with a sculpture that was recently donated to the museum's collection. Additionally, the show will include pieces by international artists such as León Ferrari and Raoul Dufv.

"For MAM São Paulo, this partnership with SESI-SP is especially significant, as it highlights the importance of collaborating with other cultural institutions. Such partnerships provide a valuable opportunity to broaden the visibility of our collection, bring the museum's works to diverse audiences, strengthen our engagement with society, and reaffirm our commitment to making art accessible to all," says Elizabeth Machado, president of MAM.

Débora Viana, Executive Manager of Culture at SESI-SP, highlights the significance of the exhibition for the institution, "One of SESI-SP's core commitments is to contribute to society by promoting education and culture. This partnership with MAM is a way of reinforcing that commitment - supporting the cultural and artistic landscape, cultivating new audiences for the arts, and expanding access to culture free of charge. Presenting this exhibition at the Centro Cultural Fiesp Art Gallery will encourage reflection and offer audiences invaluable access to a collection of profound significance to the history of both Brazilian and international art".

The exhibition will also feature works that were recently added to the museum's collection, most of which come from a major donation received in 2024. "This is a highly significant assemblage of works, comprising both modernist and contemporary pieces, which enrich the museum's collection and play a key role in the upcoming exhibition. It even includes works by European modernist artists who were previously unrepresented in MAM's collection, such as Yves Klein and Henry Moore", says Cauê Alves, MAM's Chief Curator, who organized the exhibition in collaboration with Gabriela Gotoda

One of the highlights of the recent donations is Vaso de Anêmona (Vase with Anemones (1937), a watercolor by French artist Raoul Dufy, Seeing as the piece was received via an estate donation, the museum commissioned a professional authentication process based on technical and scientific analysis. The examination was conducted by experts Gustavo Raul Perino, from Givoa Art Consulting, and Anauene Dias Soares, from Anauene Art Law.

A French art historian, hired by the consulting firm, identified the piece and verified its authenticity by cross-referencing it with the original printed version of Dufy's catalogue raisonné, as the online version did not include the watercolor. The only

other institutional collection in Brazil to possess a work by Dufy is the Museu de Arte Contemporânea da USP (MAC USP).

The exhibition also constitutes a joint effort with MAM's Education department to elucidate the concepts of modern and contemporary art, "These concepts often seem synonymous and can be hard to distinguish. Often, one visits a contemporary art museum and finds modern artworks on display. The exhibition addresses common questions identified by the MAM Education team, giving the public greater autonomy in understanding art history", says co-curator Gabriela Gotoda.

Where the Modern Meets the Contemporary

Our curatorial approach seeks to explore the differences and similarities between modern and contemporary art, drawing connections and associations between these two concepts and their respective periods within Brazilian art history.

The exhibition invites audiences to reflect on how the overlapping themes, styles, and processes found in works typically classified as modern or contemporary reveal both their affinities and distinctions, challenging the perceived divide between the two terms - modern and contemporary - and prompting a critical reconsideration of rigid historical and present-day definitions.

The convergence between and blurring of these two historical art periods is evident both in their evolution and in the critical discussions surrounding them, and is also reflected in MAM's collection. Particularly in Brazil, so-called contemporary production can be seen as an extension of one of the later modernist movements, post-war constructivism, that complicates any attempt to draw a clear chronological or conceptual division between the two.

While the origins of modern art are typically attributed to the European avantgardes at the turn of the 20th century, Brazilian modernist production spanned much of that century, often overlapping with the development of new styles and techniques associated with contemporary artistic practices.

The historical narrative of modern art in Brazil has long overlooked the production of artists now termed "popular" or "naïve", such as José Antonio da Silva, Iracema Arditi, and Heitor dos Prazeres. Contemporaries of major figures in Brazilian modernism, these artists are not widely associated with modern art precisely because they do not easily conform to the aesthetic and conceptual frameworks of the avant-gardes.

In acknowledging this oversight, the exhibition aims to contribute to the ongoing discussion about the historical narratives of modern and contemporary art, and how we perceive the passage of time between them.

Undoubtedly, there are historical and theoretical distinctions that warrant extensive discussion. But ultimately, can we truly define a precise visual and

temporal boundary between modern and contemporary art? How does this relate to our perception of historical time, and lived experience? The exhibition raises these questions, not with the aim of providing definitive answers, but rather to put forth alternative perspectives, empowering the public with the autonomy to draw their own insights through art, regardless of its historical period.

Its collection features over 5,000 works by leading figures in modern and contemporary art, with a strong emphasis on Brazilian artists.
