MAM São Paulo and Pinacoteca do Ceará hold new exhibition in Fortaleza

The exhibition is the result of a partnership between the institutions and the donation of more than 80 works by MAM to the Pinacoteca. The exhibition brings together a selection of these works and another set of pieces from the MAM collection.



The Museu de Arte Moderna de São Paulo and the Pinacoteca do Ceará have formed a partnership with the donation of 87 works from the MAM collection to the institution in Ceará. Part of the set will be presented in the never-before-seen exhibition MAM São Paulo at Pinacoteca do Ceará: Figure and landscape, word and image, which opens on June 7, 2025 at the institution based in Fortaleza, Ceará, and will be on view through September 21.

The donation is part of a review process of the MAM collection, which was inventoried between 2020 and 2022, and is made up of works that participated in different editions of the museum's Collectors Club and that were duplicated in the collection. Among the donated pieces are Klaus Mitteldorf's photograph Black and White (1991/2005); Lenora de Barros's Em forma de familia (1995/2007); Bárbara Wagner's untitled photograph, from the series Brasilia Teimosa (2006/10); and Ernesto Neto's woodcult Notice Dia (2009).

For MAM's president **Elizabeth Machado**, the donation reinforces the museum's commitment to the circulation of art and the appreciation of

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Brazilian cultural diversity: "Alongside the Pinacoteca do Ceará, we are expanding access to a collection that engages with different times and languages of art, in a partnership that celebrates the exchange between institutions and audiences from different regions of the country."

"MAM an Pinacoteca do Ceará: figura e paisagem, palavra e imagem [MAM at the Pinacoteca do Ceará: Figure and landscape, word and image] is the celebration of a partnership between two national institutions that is based on a relationship of reflection and commitment to safeguarding Brazilian art. With a donation of works by important contemporary artists, we celebrate the expansion of the Pinacoteca do Ceará collection with a dialogue and exchange that also extends to the training, mediation and education activities of both institutions", expands Rian Fontenele, general director of the Pinacoteca do Ceará.

Curated by Caué Alves and Gabriela Gotoda, the exhibition, in addition to being based on this donation, also brings together 47 other works from the MAM collection, all connected to modern and contemporary art. "The partnership between MAM São Paulo and Pinacoteca do Ceará not only increases the visibility of the collections of both museums, but also contributes to a cultural exchange," says Caué Alves. "At the same time that the diversity of artistic topics addressed by the exhibition encourages reflection on modern and contemporary art, from the perspective of museum education, the meeting between two of the most important institutions focused on Brazillan art will be a qain for the public of Ceará and São Paulo," he adds.

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The pieces are organized around two thematic axes: the relationships between figure and landscape, and between word and image. Among the highlights of the MAM collection that are part of the exhibition are an untitled drawing (1917) by Anita Malfatti, a series of monotypes from 1997 by Tunga, the painting Nu (1940) by Iberê Camargo, the work Bastidores (1997) by Rosana Paulino, the painting Saudades de Luanda, from the series Encontros Politicos (2022) by No Martins, and the painting Pescadores (1939-40) by Alfredo Voloi.

"The relationship between figure and landscape is addressed in the first section of the exhibition, where the works brought together elaborate different points of view on an issue dear to the history of art and the transformations promoted since the modernist avant-garde movements," explains Gabriela Gotoda. "The links between word and image are analogous to the relationships between figure and landscape, and come into focus in the final section, where pieces that contain letters, words and texts put into perspective the apprehension of written language in the context of an imagetic construction."
